THE CAPITAL GETS GREENER

1. SAVING ENERGY

- Combat global warming by encouraging energy saving projects, such as distribution of **energy saving light bulbs** to elderly people, persuading businesses to turn their **lights out** at night and collecting and **recycling toner cartridges**

2. GREEN ENVIRONMENT

- Undertake projects which improve the **green environment** in London, in association with the London Wildlife Trust www.wildlondon.org.uk Registered Charity No 283895

Conservation Education

- Curriculum based conservation projects in schools: help a local school to set up a Wildlife Club through the LWT Schools membership scheme (£98 will enable a school to benefit from a planning session with a member of LWT Education staff to plan the first six sessions of a wildlife club)

Hands-on volunteering

- improve a green space in your area by planting trees or creating a wildlife area, whilst benefiting from LWT's advice and experience
- encourage rotarians and businesses to provide practical help on a "Work Day" at one of LWT's key sites around London

Water projects

- Help save the water vole by taking part in the LWT survey
- Clean up a river bank or stream in your area

Wildlife can be a key indicator of the condition of the local environment and people's quality of life. Improvement of parks, gardens and communal spaces make urban areas more attractive places to live and benefit local communities.
