ENVIRONMENT TEAM STARTS WORK

With our enthusiasm for all things environmental, on Sunday 20th April, a team of Rotarians from District 1130 took part in the first Rotary Environment Work day on Sunday 20th April.

Working under the guidance of a London Wildlife Trust and their local volunteers, Rotarians helped to build a fence, cut back hedges and clear up rubbish along one of the boundaries of Totteridge Fields (North London), an area of ancient hay meadows criss-crossed by hawthorn and blackthorn hedgerows. Despite being on the edge of London, these ancient grasslands are a fantastic habitat for birds, butterflies and insect life and are the best example of its type in the London area.
